ANA GOVERNANCE PROJECT HAPPENINGS

This Port Graham ANA article is the first article for Year Two! The Port Graham Village Council has been awarded the ANA Non-Competing Continuation Grant on September 19, 2012, meaning this ANA Governance Project has been awarded to continue for another year. During our Year One, ANA Project we have accomplished many of the objective work plans, from the Local Tribal Membership ANA Survey (you can check out the results on the Port Graham website; www.portgraham.org), also creating a Council Office Staff & Council Member Personal Assessment forms, in which would provide needed information to provide and schedule relevant trainings as part of their roles and responsibilities.

These assessment forms were developed by the ANA Advisory/ Training Committee and Project Partner, Chugachmiut too be utilized by the Port Graham Village Council Office to measure office staff and Council Members current abilities in relation to their job responsibilities. This will benefit two ways, one; to assess the full training needs to determine the most effective, relevant and economical means in provide trainings for office staff and council members and two; will continue to be utilized on an annual/semi-annual bases to measure and track office staff work performances and help determine, as needed follow-up trainings. Year Two Objectives are to continue and complete trainings for the Port Graham Village Council Members and Office Staff that began in the first 12 months, with both off-site and on-site trainings and follow-up training to be scheduled based on an evaluation tool that was also developed by the Port Graham ANA Advisory/Training Committee. This evaluation tool was developed for evaluating the effectiveness of trainings received, to measure how well the trainings were accepted and how much was learned through this process.

JOB OPENINGS IN PORT GRAHAM

ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNICIAN

Primary responsibilities include:

Development and implementation of the Indian General Assistance Program (IGAP) environmental projects under the direction of the Port Graham Village Council. The Environ- mental Technician (ET) will work as directed on environmental issues with local, State and Federal agencies.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

- 1. Assist Environmental Planner with the design and execute environmental presentations' on household hazardous waste, landfill maintenance, indoor air quality, etc., to be attended by tribal members in community.
- 2. Assist Environmental Planner with planning and implementation of environmental work plan.
- 3. Establish and maintain an environmental office within the community.
- 4. Submit written reports to Tribal Council on knowledge gained from training, work- shop, or conferences attended.
- 5. Schedule regular contact with Environmental Planner and Tribal Council supervisor for the purpose of work assignments, oversight, and technical assistance.
- 6. Assist Environmental Planner with coordination and planning of the Annual Village Clean-Up.
- 7. Assist with monitoring of Household Hazmat site.
- 8. Any other duties as assigned to complete projects with program and Village Council.
- 9. Ability to work with little or no supervision.

Qualifications:

- High School Diploma required
- Strong interest in environmental issues or preferred experience working on environ- mental related issues
- Strong written and verbal communication skills preferred
- Mandatory experience with computers and computer software
- Be able to do physical labor (lift up to 50 pounds)

Work Conditions:

Hours of work are as assigned by supervisor, generally Monday to Friday; 9:00am to 4:00pm.

Port Graham Village Council maintains a drug free and non-smoking environment.

Library Chatter on Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

I am looking into a literacy program called Best Beginnings. It provides matching funds and technical assistance to communities that wish to start their own Imagination Libraries.



The communities raise funds, promote the program, register the children, and enter information into a database. The Dolly-wood Foundation: manages the system and mails the books.

We are looking forward to having the Dolly Parton, Imagination Library for Port Grahams Youth. It offers free books to children ages Birth through 4 years of age. I have contacted a number of parents of children this age and will be arranging for a meeting of all interested parties soon. If you are interested, please stop by the library and get yourself on the imagination library 'mailing list'.

Best Beginnings is a public-private partnership that mobilizes people and resources to ensure all Alaska children begin school ready to succeed through support from businesses, foundations, nonprofits, government, and individuals.

Lolita Brache, one of the Best Beginnings organizers, said this system offers the cheapest investment anyone can make towards helping more children enter school ready to learn. "If we can really get more books into more homes and encourage families to read to the children more often, we can have a huge impact on school readiness," she said.

Imagination Library is not just a book delivery program; it is designed to get a whole community involved with helping their children succeed in school. To make it successful and ensure its sustainability over time, it is important to spread the work around. Every Imagination Library must have local residents who can fulfill certain tasks.

December is Seasonal Depression Awareness Month

Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD) makes people feel depressed as a result of less sunlight during winter months. Seasonal depression is common among people who live in climates where it rains most of the year, or where there is drastically decreased sunlight. (like here in



Port Graham) SAD has recently been recognized as a medical condition, and there are a wide variety of treatments for those who suffer from seasonal depression, for instance, *light therapy box*, soak *in the sun*, *regular sleeping habits*, *drink milk for vitamin D*, use

St. Johns Wort, do yoga to help regulate melatonin.



SAD is a condition best avoided.

But, if it does afflict, opt for natural cures. They are safe and effective with no side effects. However, whatever remedies you may adopt, don't forget to consult your physician first.
