Camai! Ggwi Apamia; My name is Ephimia Dumont.



Tribal Membership Survey Results

ADMINISTRATION FOR NATIVE AMERICANS PROJECT COORDINATOR Daryl Kreun

This ANA activity of the “**Local Port Graham Tribal Membership Survey**” was drawn out in the ANA Governance Project and its purpose is to measure the tribal membership in regards to their elected Council Members & Council Office, then compare it with a “post-project survey” at the end of this Project to measure the effectiveness of this project. Over all we had an 80% survey participation, (63) returned out of (79) of all Local Tribal Members, those are great numbers and thank you to everyone that participated.



The first portion of the survey was about “**Tribal Member Participation**”, how involved are the tribal members; 60% attend annual meetings, 67% attend & vote in every tribal elections, 91% read the community newsletter. The numbers are great for voting and reading the newsletters then you look at 57% do not contribute to the newsletter, 71% are not involved in a committee and 84% have never ran for a Council Member position.

The second portion, “**Council Operations**”, 73% do understand how the Council operates but 46% are not aware of all the programs available through the Council Offices. With 52% feel that the Council *is responsive* to the needs of the community and 37% feel the Council *is not responsive*, 8% feel somewhat & (2) with no response.



As for Council “**Responsiveness**” & “**Effectiveness**”, 70% feel that the “Responsiveness” *is above average* to average and 79% feel the “Effectiveness” *is also above average to average* with (1) tribal member with no response, great numbers for this portion.

For Council & Council Office “**Identification & Resolution**” as for bringing issues/concerns to the attention of the Council,

51% have brought issues forward, with a 41% satisfaction. For the Council Offices, 48% have brought issues forward, with a 47% satisfaction with (2) somewhat & (1) no response. In this section, you can read it as the remaining percentages in both Council & Council Office either did not bring their issues/concerns forward or didn’t have issues or concerns too bring forward.



JOB OPENINGS IN PORT GRAHAM

ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNICIAN

Primary responsibilities include:

Development and implementation of the Indian General Assistance Program (IGAP) environmental projects under the direction of the Port Graham Village Council. The Environmental Technician (ET) will work as directed on environmental issues with local, State and Federal agencies.

Essential Duties and Responsibilities:

1. Assist Environmental Planner with the design and execute environmental presentations' on household hazardous waste, landfill maintenance, indoor air quality, etc., to be attended by tribal members in community.
2. Assist Environmental Planner with planning and implementation of environmental work plan.
3. Establish and maintain an environmental office within the community.
4. Submit written reports to Tribal Council on knowledge gained from training, work- shop, or conferences attended.
5. Schedule regular contact with Environmental Planner and Tribal Council supervisor for the purpose of work assignments, oversight, and technical assistance.
6. Assist Environmental Planner with coordination and planning of the Annual Village Clean-Up.
7. Assist with monitoring of Household Hazmat site.
8. Any other duties as assigned to complete projects with program and Village Council.
9. Ability to work with little or no supervision.

Qualifications:

- High School Diploma required
- Strong interest in environmental issues or preferred experience working on environmental related issues
- Strong written and verbal communication skills preferred
- Mandatory experience with computers and computer software
- Be able to do physical labor (lift up to 50 pounds)

Work Conditions:

Hours of work are as assigned by supervisor, generally Monday to Friday; 9:00am to 4:00pm.

Port Graham Village Council maintains a drug free and non-smoking environment.

Tribal Office Receptionist:

Primary responsibility will be to answer phones on Monday's, Wednesday's and Friday's in a professional manner.

Office Building & General Maintenance:

Responsible for building maintenance of all buildings owned by PGVC. Snow removal at the council parking, entrances, porches, roof and balcony.

Tribal ICWA Worker:

This is a half time position in Port Graham which works at the direction of the Tribal Council to develop and implement programs which are designed to prevent break up of Alaska Native families.

Community Health Representative:

Acting as the liaison between PG's CHR program and community residents, coordinating community activities with the assistance of the village council or its representative and providing outreach and assistance to individuals and families and the community.

Janitor:

Keeping all the bathrooms, hallways, rooms, kitchens in the mush, alcohol office building, green house and public safety building clean and sanitized.

Folks of all ages are encouraged to come and have a little fun together like arts & crafts, games, and playing music!




November is National Native American Heritage Month!





Hi Everyone! I am the new Tribal Youth Coordinator. Since September, I have held a meeting with the youth to develop a schedule of activities for the coming months. We also discussed future projects that need to be completed next year. One of the projects is for the youth to create a Public Service Announcement on native culture and preservation; it will focus on subsistence skills, traditional dances, and/or language. The youth have come up with an idea and now to make it happen.



October 30th was the start of our Elder and Youth Potlucks. Thank you to Pat for donating a whole seal to the Tribal Youth Program and to Mickey and Moose for cooking the seal. People were very pleased and stuffed when they left the potluck. I overheard comments referring to the potluck being one of the best they have been to in a while because there was so much good native food. There were only 7 packages of seal and that was able to stretch for over 45 people! Of course there were more dishes that others had brought in but that is impressive that it fed so many people. Elders were sure happy to be able to take home a dish for later. Thank you to everyone who attended and left with a full belly!

The Paluwik Alutiiq Dance group has started up again. We meet every Thursday from 7-8pm. Everyone and anyone is invited to join the group. We love to see new faces join or to encourage others. The current participants have come so far in the few weeks we have been gathering. They will also be creating a few new dance outfits. We just received our leather and beads in, so if you have any beading or sewing expertise we would greatly appreciate any help. Our first performance will be at the Christmas program with many more to come.

Enhancement Grant

Hello !

I am pleased to announce that Port Graham received an enhancement grant through the Native American Library Services. The Native Village of Port Graham will use their grant funds to begin identifying and inventorying material relating to Port Graham's history held in a variety of Alaskan repositories and early visitors' personal collections. The librarian will receive hands-on training in research and basic archival management at several Anchorage archives that hold materials of interest to Port Graham. A research consultant will work with the librarian to conduct at least two Elder gatherings during the project. Community youth will be invited to witness the history as it is remembered and discussed by their elders. The sessions will be recorded, transcribed, and added as a complement to the archival materials, providing a fresh look at the region's local history from many personal perspectives.

I look forward to working with the elders to learn more about who we are, who we were, and where we came from through the research made possible through this grant. Please stop by the library and see what progress has been made. I also encourage everyone to see how the family tree project is progressing!
